



Home Learning project **Eureka! Ancient Greece** **(Optional)**



Although the Ancient Greeks lived over 2500 years ago, there are still remains of the buildings that they constructed around for us to see today. These do not look exactly as they would have when the Ancient Greeks were alive but it is amazing that there are any remains left to be seen at all. The different buildings include temples, theatres and market places where people would have met together (the agora).

One of the most famous temples still visible today is the Parthenon in Athens, which was started in 477BCE and took 48 years to build. The temples were all slightly different but had a common feature of tall columns which held up the large roof above. (Imagine how difficult they must have been to build without any of the modern machinery we have today).

Find out about a Greek building and how it was built. You may choose to find out about a temple, theatre, gymnasium, house or any other building of your choice.

You could: draw a detailed diagram labelling the different parts of the building, build a model using any material of your choice, or make a power point presentation about your building.
