FICTION

Narrative and poetry writing based on novels set in the Victorian era - Street Child and Oliver Twist.

Exploring the differences between a film narrative and a written narrative, using the dramatic conventions of script writing.

NON - FICTION:

Writing non-chronological reports about life in the Victorian era, information texts about the Great Exhibition and biographies of key Victorian figures.

MATHEMATICS

Multiplication and Division:

Multiplying up to 4-digit numbers by 1 and 2 digit numbers using formal written methods. Dividing up to 4-digit numbers by single digit numbers using formal written methods (bus stop method).

Know how to deal with remainders.

Fractions: Multiply a fraction by unit integers. Find fractions of amounts.

Decimals and Percentages:

Recognising decimals as fractions.

Comparing, ordering and rounding decimals.

Understanding percentages and the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages.

Perimeter and area: Finding the perimeter and area of rectilinear shapes. Estimating.
