

ENGLISH

FICTION: Greek myths and legends -

Make comparisons between oral and written versions of a story. Write own versions of a Greek legend, showing awareness of the audience and using humour and repetition.

Hear, read, and respond to a range of free verse poems from a range of writers. Explore writing own list type or monologue free verse poem.

NON-FICTION: Read and respond to newspaper interviews, establishing the difference between fact and opinion. Write an historical event as a newspaper article including quotes.

Edit and redraft own and others work, considering use of precise vocabulary, such as powerful verbs, adverbs and varied sentence openers.

Common spelling patterns, sentence structure and word class.

MATHEMATICS (Fractions):

- Multiplying fractions, improper fractions and mixed numbers by a whole number
- Finding a fraction of a quantity
- Finding the whole when a fraction is known
- Comparing two fractions
- Finding and describing equivalent fractions
- Recalling common fraction-decimal equivalents
- Solving a variety of problems in different contexts
